



Bangladesh land slide incident.

Date Of Incident: 15.06.10

Location : Bangladesh

Description of the accident:

24 hours of nonstop and heavy rainfall in Southeast Bangladesh resulted in powerful landslides on early morning. The landslide actually hit the Cox's Bazaar hill and resort district which is about 185 miles (296 kilometers) south of the Bangladesh capital, Dhaka. Bangladesh landslides killed 53 people, including visitors buried alive at a sea resort, refugees in an encampment and army men in barracks.

No. of persons Injured:

More than 40 people have lost their life in this landslide.

Potential Root Cause:

Heavy Rain and flood.

Other possible news about the incident:

Numerous houses in the village were smashed. Many were buried alive. Many people have gone missing. Rescuers have started their operation.

Apart from the villagers, 7 soldiers are also missing from a makeshift camp.

The incessant rain was due to a depression that had developed over Bay of Bengal. The rainfall recorded 25 cm in 24 hours in the hilly and forest region.

The south and northeastern districts of Bangladesh are very prone to landslides every year during rainy season. In the year 2007 almost 130 people died due to landslide in Chittagong alone.

It has been predicted by The United Nations Inter-governmental Panel on Climate Change that Bangladesh will lose one fifth of its total land by the year 2050 due to global warming which will result in rise of sea water.
